


Ancient Civilizations TAKE AWAY TASKS

1: Create your own square-based pyramid, just like the Egyptians did (you could use Lego or sugar cubes, instead of giant stone blocks). Make sure the base is a square.



2: Create a coordinate map of Egypt and plot the coordinates of important archaeological finds, such as the Valley of the Kings, and the Great Pyramid at Giza.



3: Find some modern or traditional Egyptian music, and create your own dance routine. You might like to work in a group for this task.




4: Make some Egyptian flat bread. <https://www.karenskitchenstories.com/2017/06/aish-baladi-egyptian-flatbread.html>

Make an Egyptian Basboosa cake. <http://allrecipes.co.uk/recipe/939/basboosa.asp>


5: Write a message to your family or friends in hieroglyphics.



6: Imagine you are an archaeologist like Howard Carter. On a dig in Ancient Egypt, you uncover the fossil of an unknown creature! Create a model of your creature using modelling clay or papier mache, and write a paragraph to describe it.



7: Create your mummy OR own tomb or coffin for a mummy. Remember they are decorated with a picture of the person and show off their wealth.



8: Research an Ancient Egyptian Pharaoh and create a fact file for them.




9: Design and create an Egyptian adventure themed board game – you could use dice and make your own counters, and have quiz questions or tasks on squares that players land on.


Some ideas are:

11: The Rosetta Stone is one of the most important archaeological finds in history. Research it, and produce a report to tell your class all about it. Make sure you include diagrams and sub-headings, and make it as eye-catching as possible.



12: Using the words – Ancient Egypt create an acrostic poem.
